Sustrans:	Sustrans personnel will visit pupils in Primary 1 – 5 on Monday 23 rd April. They deliver classroom based programme on Road Safety and Carbon Footprint.

Confirmation :	This will take place in St Mary's Church Arney on Sunday 22 nd April at 3.00pm
First Communion:	This will take place in St Patrick's Church Holywell on Saturday the 2 nd June at 11.00am. All Key Stage 2 pupils are asked to keep this date free to sing in the choir on that day.
Attendance:	The Department of Education is looking at attendance very closely at present. We get a monthly report of all children's attendance. If a child's attendance falls below 85% we are asked to refer them to our Educational Welfare Officer.
Child Protection:	The Designated teacher for Child Protection is Mrs Martina Meehan. The Deputy Designated Teacher is Mrs Anne Murray. Our Safeguarding team also includes; Mrs Clara Martin (Designated Governor), Mr Gerry McAloon (Chairman Board of Governors) and Mr Liam Magee (Principal)
Hair:	Please check your child's hair regularly and, if necessary, treat thoroughly with any lotion recommended by a chemist or doctor.
Party invitations:	We ask that parents do not to send party invitations to school for circulation- this may cause distress to some children.
Phone Numbers:	Please let the school know if your home, work or mobile telephone number has changed.
School Uniform:	It is important that each child comes to school neat and tidy. School uniform must be worn each day unless special clothing is required e.g. for field trip. Children must change into plimsoles - for indoor wear <u>Please label all items of clothing.</u> Department of Education Circular 2011/04 "PE is a compulsory part of the statutory curriculum from age 4 to 16. Clothing and footwear are important aspects to safety in PE. A change of clothing for PE is important, including at primary school, for reasons of hygiene and to ensure the clothing is suited to the physical activity"

<u>All children who walk to school or travel by car</u> <u>should use the small pedestrian gate. We ask that</u> <u>you do not use the main gate in the interest of the</u> <u>health and safety of all.</u>

IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY ONLY STAFF CARS SHOULD ENTER THE SCHOOL CAR PARK.

<u>Please do not park in the bus lay-by at the front of the</u> <u>school- this area is now clearly marked. Parking here</u> <u>presents a hazard for children boarding buses and prevents</u> <u>buses from pulling in.</u>
